

Green School Expert Coming to Greenville on June 11, 2001

Upstate Forever, a non-profit organization that promotes sensible land use, sustainable development, and the protection of special places in the Upstate region of South Carolina is sponsoring a seminar on Green School development to be held Monday, June 11 beginning at 4:00 p.m.

Architect Mike Nicklas of Innovative Design in Raleigh, North Carolina and one of the nation's leading experts on green schools will give a lecture on sustainable school design and construction. Mr. Nicklas will discuss the advantages of green schools and why they cost less, improve student performance, and have better air quality. Mr. Nicklas's firm has designed and overseen the construction of more than twenty sustainable schools, including Durant Middle School in Raleigh and Clayton Elementary School in Clayton, North Carolina.
