Agro-forest specialist at Upstate Forever

Colombian agro-forester Carlos Alfredo Cortes will travel to the U.S. for five weeks on a Climate Change Fellowship offered by Partners of the Americas through the Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs. Cortes will work at Upstate Forever, a nonprofit organization specializing in the promotion of land conservation, air and water quality protection, and sustainable development.

In his current work in Colombia, Cortes designs strategies for the sustainable management of natural resources and agro-ecosystems. While in South Carolina, Cortes

will research programs that would improve local air quality and reduce local climate change emissions while retaining financial resources in our region.
