

## Lake Greenwood/Saluda River water quality meeting scheduled

Concerned residents from several Lake Greenwood communities will meet for a second time to learn more about what can be done to improve water quality in Lake Greenwood and the Saluda River Watershed area. The meeting is scheduled for 7 p.m. Tuesday, July 14, at "The Depot" in Ninety Six. The first meeting was held June 18 at Puckett's Ferry Clubhouse, with some 90 lake area residents attending from neighborhoods including Puckett's Ferry, Crystal Bay, Harborside, Grand Harbor,

Stoney Point, Eagles Harbor, Ridgewood Harbor and Waterloo.

At this second organizational and informational meeting, Julie Davis of Greenwood County Lake Management and Lisa Wicklyffe Augustine of **Upstate Forever** in Greenville will address and answer questions related to water quality issues in Lake Greenwood and beyond. DHEC representatives have again been invited, as well as several legislators and county councilmen from Laurens and Greenwood counties. Reps.

Mike Pitts, Mark Willis and Jeff Duncan are planning to attend. Residents are encouraged to show their interest by attending this meeting and bringing any questions they may have about the lake.

The Ninety Six Depot will accommodate more than was available in the standing-room-only Puckett's Ferry meeting place, according to coordinator Karen Boylan. The Depot is located at 101 N.W.
